

Last month I attended my annual training session for maintaining my security clearance in the prison service. I continued, "I also have a problem with being your 'friend' when you and your brother clerics are telling your followers to kill me!

Let me ask you a question. Would you rather have your Allah who tells you to kill me in order for you to go to heaven, or my Jesus who tells me to love you because He will take me to heaven and He wants you to be there with me?"

You could have heard a pin drop as the Imam remained speechless.

Needless to say, the organisers of the Diversification Seminar were not happy with this way of exposing the truth about Muslims' beliefs.

Within twenty years, i.e. 2029, there will be enough Muslim voters in the U.K. to elect a government of their choice, complete with Sharia law.

Everyone in the U.K. should be required to read this, but with the current political paralysis, tolerant justice system, liberal media and p.c. madness, there is no way this will be widely publicised.

### *Sunday, 14<sup>th</sup> March*

Our thanks to Veronica for focusing us on the importance of prayer.

Veronica drew our attention to Psalm 139: 23-24 (quoted on front page of last week's Bulletin) and asked: "Could we be the dam stopping the flow of the water?"

In preparation for Communion, Veronica read 1Corinthians 11: 23-28. (Do take time to read these words again ~ if possible in 'The Message' ~ the Bible in contemporary language). These verses are very serious. Do we take them too lightly?

2 Chronicles 7:14 ~ our land is in danger, and restoration starts with us, God's people humbly seeking his face and turning from evil. There was a time of quiet reflection and confession after which Veronica prayed a prayer of confession for the church.

We then remembered the Lord's death on the cross in breaking bread together, recognising that great sacrifice for each one of us with awe and reverence.

Mark 11:24 ~ *Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours.* Quote from Andrew Murray, prayer intercessor: 'Faith has to accept the answer given by God in heaven, before it is found or felt on earth. It is the very essence of believing prayer, a real secret.' Quoting from Dutch Sheets: 'A lack of endurance is one of the greatest causes of defeat. We don't wait well. We're into microwaving. God, on the other hand, is into marinating.' *Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up.* (Galatians 6:9).
